About colposcopy

You have been invited to colposcopy because your cervical screening results have shown you have [HPV/HPV and cell changes].

At colposcopy, a colposcopist will take a closer, more detailed look at your cervix. They may do some tests, such as putting liquid on your cervix to highlight any cell changes or taking a small piece of tissue (biopsy) from your cervix. The results from this will help us to understand whether you need treatment or to come back for future appointments to check your cervix.
